REPORT ON THE LEAGUE OF THE SOUTH NATIONAL CONFERENCE AND THE SECOND NORTH AMERICAN SECESSIONIST CONVENTION

Thirty-two media interviews in three days. Television, radio, and print media from New York to Seattle and from Houston to Chicago. Even a 'hit piece' from Fox News (surprised?). Secession and independence is now a hot topic thanks to the League National Conference and the preceding Second North American Secessionist Convention.

If you missed these events, you missed something special.

On 3-4 October, some 70 delegates and observers from about two dozen secessionist organizations gathered at the Marriott Hotel in beautiful Chattanooga, Tennessee, to organize, plan, and discuss the strategy and tactics of North American secession. The League of the South co-hosted the event, along with the Middlebury Institute of New York, and was the largest group represented.

On Wednesday morning, 3 October, an Associated Press article by correspondent Bill Poovey went nationwide. It was picked up online by the Drudge Report, Yahoo News, and other sites and soon was all over the internet and other media. Those thirty-two interviews I mentioned above were only the ones I did personally. Franklin Sanders, David Jones, Ray McBerry, Mark Thomey, and other LS officers, as well as Dr. Tom Naylor (Second Vermont Republic) and Kirkpatrick Sale (Middlebury Institute) did many more. Just to give the reader some idea of the scope of television coverage alone, the League and Southern independence were the subjects on sixty-one separate news programs on 3-4 October. Before I left for Chattanooga on the early afternoon of 3 October, we were getting thousands of hits per hour on our Dixienet website until someone high up pulled the plug on us for several hours (see 'An Attack on Our Website,' p. 5). The raw numbers speak for themselves: on Tuesday, 2 October, we got between 700-800 hits on Dixienet; the following day we received nearly 70,000, and on the day after that we got almost 140,000. That's quite a jump in traffic, wouldn't you say? Since that peak, we have averaged about 25,000 hits per day from 5-15 October.

Despite all the nationwide fuss over the League and secession, we still had far too many empty chairs at the national conference. While attendance was up

from last year, we need to fill *every seat*. Where were you?

Now that we have been given a tremendous boost by all the media coverage and the resulting spate of new LS memberships, we *must* take advantage of this opportunity. That means that every single LS member needs to do whatever is necessary in his State or local community to promote our agenda. When the League meets, you should be there.

I'm as encouraged and energised as I've ever been. I hope you are, too. We have much work to do, and we must do it together. Also, we must commit ourselves to doing the 'little things' that will make our step-by-step journey to independence successful.

Let's begin by doubling our membership during the next year. That means simply that each current LS member recruit *one* new member over the next twelve months, hardly a daunting task. Also, we can help by attending the next LS national conference, our 15th, God willing. Most likely, we'll be in Chattanooga again in October 2008. Mark your calendars. In the meantime, roll up your sleeves and help us make the most of the present opportunity. We dare not waste it.

The Chattanooga Declaration

The Chattanooga Declaration was drafted and approved by delegates to the Second North American Secessionist Convention on 4 October 2007.

'We, the delegates of the Secession movements represented at the Second North American Secessionist Convention, acknowledging our differences, yet agree on the following truths:

1. The deepest questions of human liberty and government facing our time go beyond right and left, and in fact have made the old right-left split meaningless and dead.

2. The privileges, monopolies, and powers that private corporations have won from government threaten everyone's health, prosperity, and liberty, and have already killed American self-government by the people.

3. The power of corporations endangers liberty as much as government power, especially when they are combined as in the American Empire.

4. Liberty can only survive if political power is returned from faraway and self-interested centers to local communities and States.

5. The American Empire is no longer a nation or a republic, but has become a tyrant aggressive abroad and despotic at home.

6. The States of the American union are and of right ought to be, free and self-governing.

7. Without secession, liberty and self-government can never be sustained, and diversity among human societies can never survive.'

Red State-Blue State Secessionists Unite

Flag-waving patriots didn't like it one bit. Nor did left-wing Democrats, right-wing Republicans, the Bush administration's neocon mafia, the Israeli lobby, Corporate America, Fox news, CNN, National Public Radio, Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders, The Nation, The Wall Street Journal, or The New York Times. The have-gun-will-travel Southern Poverty Law Center was absolutely beside itself. And what exactly was it that they all didn't like?

On October 3-4 representatives from thirty state separatist movements met in Chattanooga, Tennessee to discuss peaceable ways to dissolve the American Empire. Delegates came from as far away as California, Alaska, Oregon, Vermont, and New Hampshire joining Southerners from Texas, Georgia, South Carolina, and North Carolina. Sponsored by the New England based Middlebury Institute and The League of the South, the Second North American Secessionist Convention brought together a strange mix of so-called blue state liberals and red state conservatives committed to the peaceful breakup of the Empire.

There was only one issue on the table—the Empire. There was no time whatsoever for discussion of such divisive issues as race, religion, class, sexuality, or immigration. Delegates from both camps sniffed each other out, acknowledged their differences, and remained steadfastly on topic for two full days.

Delegates took note of the fact that our government has lost its moral authority and that our nation is unsustainable, ungovernable, and, therefore, unfixable. Both the Democratic and Republican parties were dismissed as completely irrelevant as are the yahoos running for president.

Near the end of the convention nearly all delegates signed the 'Chattanooga Declaration.' The declaration listed seven truths upon which most delegates agreed. It acknowledged the fact that the left-right dichotomy was an anachronism from the past exploited by politicians to help keep us divided. It further noted that the Bush administration has tried to resurrect the left-right divide to gain support for its convoluted war on terrorism.

Traditionally, conservatives have blamed all of our problems on the federal government. Liberals, on the other hand, blame Corporate America for our ills. Both sides are right. The U.S. government is owned, operated, and controlled by Corporate America.

The terms liberal and conservative have no meaning anymore. The real issues are size, scale, and empire, not Iraq, the economy, health care, or immigration. The American Empire is the most powerful, most militaristic, most violent, most racist, most imperialistic empire of all time. That's the only issue that really matters.

The entire convention was energized by an Associated Press piece by Bill Poovey released a few hours before the convention began. In his extremely well written piece, Poovey quoted University of North Carolina Profes-

or Harry Watson who said that the unlikely red state–blue state partnering 'represents the far left and far right of American politics coming together.'

The AP story was picked up by hundreds of radio stations, TV stations, websites, and newspapers nationwide. League of the South President Michael Hill gave over thirty-five interviews. Fox News, CNN, National Public Radio, and the Financial Times covered the convention. It even made Jay Leno's monologue!

The meeting ended with the delegate from the Second Vermont Republic inviting others to join Vermont in a 'Genteel Revolution' of thoughtful writers, artists, academics, blue collar workers, doctors, farmers, lawyers, merchants, and other rebels committed to helping save America and the rest of the world from the American Empire.

May God bless the *Untied* States of America!

An Attack On Our Website And Our Freedom Of Speech Big Media Comes After DixieNet.Org During The Largest Secessionist Gathering In North America!

If you visit DixieNet, you will find the following message: 'The website you are currently viewing is the template for the latest version of DixieNet.Org. You may notice that some of the pages are 'under construction.' The reason for this is because we had not planned to launch this version of the website for another 48 hours. Had we been able to maintain our website launch timetable there would have been no unfinished pages on our site.

So why launch so early?

The answer to that question transforms a simple website launch issue into a prime example of how the free speech rights of Americans are at serious risk of being taken away. Particularly when the viewpoint being presented calls into question the political status quo here in these united States.

This week the League of the South, along with a number of other pro-secessionist organisations from all across North America are participating in the North American Secessionist Convention (NASC) in Chattanooga, Tennessee. This event is the largest gathering of secessionists in the world. In addition to the NASC, the League will also be holding its annual national convention in the same city.

These events have generated a considerable amount of interest by the media. In particular, our President, Dr. J.

Michael Hill was interviewed by the Associated Press about the League's involvement in the NASC. That AP article has been carried in newspapers, the Drudge Report, and TV stations in both America and Europe. Part of the article included a link to one of our secondary domain names (leagueofthesouth.net). At some point this morning (3 October 2007) we discovered that our website was not available on the Internet. After some investigation we discovered that despite the fact that all of our fees were paid our website had been suspended. We purchase our web space from a company that acts as a reseller of hosting services. While this company has control over whom they choose to do business with, it was not the reseller that suspended our website.

Apparently, it was one of the larger companies that sells these services wholesale to our provider that decided to suspend our website, and they chose to do so without informing either our provider or us of this action. After using the same provider for quite an extended period of time, we find it quite the coincidence that this decision was made on the day that one of the biggest news stories in the history of the modern secessionist movement was to go global!

We are compelled to ask if someone is trying to prevent the message of the League of the South from reaching a wider audience? If so, who would have the kind of power required to force our provider to pull the plug on our website and effectively silence our message on the Internet?

It certainly concerns us, and we hope that all freedom loving people everywhere (regardless of how they feel about the League of the South or the secessionist movement) will be equally concerned, for if the free speech rights of the League of the South are not safe, no one's are!

Has the League of the South Sold Out?

A Slightly Disgruntled Reader Wants to Know

Q: I am not encouraged at all with your merging with the Vermont liberals. In the document your group issued, you attack private enterprise like the socialists do, and come out in favor of diversity. Is this the League of the South I joined? How does this help the Cause of conservatism?

A: First of all, the North American Secessionist Convention was a forum for exchanging ideas, not a merger of the various groups that participated. The League of the South is still a separate organization, with its own goals and values, as is the Second Vermont Republic. As we stated in our press release, our purpose for coming together was to meet with other groups pursuing secession and to 'provide a forum for the representatives of those movements to discuss strategies, exchange ideas and information, and find areas of mutual understanding and cooperation.' And that's exactly what we did. The representatives discussed projects they'd undertaken to promote their cause, what succeeded or failed, and what they'd learned from them. After a day of stimulating discussion, followed by an evening of drinks, jokes, and good food, we exchanged contact information and parted as friendly, but entirely distinct, movements.

More important, the League of the South has not abandoned Southern traditionalism or conservatism. By

'diversity,' we're referring to genuine diversity, which is the maintenance of healthy cultural and political traditions within different nations, as well as the differences among individuals within society. The fifth item of Russell Kirk's *principles of conservatism* reflects the conservative's respect for the life-giving variety of Creation, as well as conservatism's rejection of today's bogus version of 'diversity,' which actually means enforced uniformity through the destruction of natural differences —something both multicult leftists and globalist Neocons advocate in the name of universalism. Kirk rightly condemns such a project as the 'narrowing uniformity and deadening egalitarianism of radical systems.' Conservatives see variety as an engine of growth and mutual enrichment, while it is socialists of all stripes, national and international, who demand that the world be standardised according to their artificial ideals.

I suppose your charge that we're attacking private enterprise came from these items in the *Chattanooga Declaration*:

2. The privileges, monopolies, and powers that private corporations have won from government threaten everyone's health, prosperity, and liberty, and have already killed American self-government by the people.
3. The power of corporations endangers liberty as much as government power, especially when they are combined as in the American Empire.

These statements are not an attack on private property or free enterprise, but

on the alliance of big government and big business. These positions are squarely in the Southern tradition, which has long opposed the use of big government to redistribute wealth, whether to minority groups that return the favor by voting for their generous politicians, or to politically connected corporations. Welfare is welfare, and is wrong, no matter who is the beneficiary.

Eugene Genovese outlined the Southern objection to mercantilism and socialism as variations of the same formula of tyranny:

'Richard Weaver was openly attacking capitalism and modern bourgeois society, as well as socialism and communism. Thus, he followed the Southern Agrarians back to the ideas of John Randolph of Roanoke and John Taylor of Caroline, whose thought he especially appreciated for its commitment to a widespread dispersal of property and political power and opposition to the allocation of wealth by political means.' (*The Southern Tradition*, p. 12)

Here's what John Taylor had to say about the pre-fascist alliance of big business and big government against the antebellum South:

'A balance of power between two combinations of states, and not the existence of slavery, gave rise to this unfortunate, and absurd controversy. Banking, funding, and tariff interests united to beget the Missouri project, and that project

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begat the idea of using slavery as an instrument for effecting a balance of power.'

Interesting, isn't it, that the anti-Southern coalition before the Civil War used the highfaluting language of liberation, just as today's Neocons do? It's no coincidence that in each case, big government and big business united to consolidate power and treasure in their hands. Both justified their actions in the name of universal rights.

And as Frank Owsley observed in *I'll Take My Stand*:

'Big business has more often taken refuge behind the national government than behind the state. I have only to call attention to the way in which corporations take refuge behind the Fourteenth Amendment to avoid state legislation, to the numberless cases brought before the Supreme Court of the United States by corporations whose charters have been vitiated or nullified by state action, to the refuge sought by the railroads in national protection against the state granger legislation, and to the eternal whine of big business for paternalistic and exploitative legislation such as the tariff, the ship and railroad subsidies. Historically, then, the vested interests of industrialism have not had any great use for state rights. They are the founders of the doctrine of centralisation, of the Hamiltonian and Republican principles; they have controlled the Republican party; why should they be unfriendly to their own

principles and their own political instrument?' (p. 86.)

If you need final confirmation that this project promotes long-established Southern ideals, consider item 5 from our joint Declaration:

5. The American Empire is no longer a nation or a republic, but has become a tyrant aggressive abroad and despotic at home.

That should cheer every Southern heart. It echoes Robert E. Lee's post-war warning about the consequences of losing State sovereignty:

'The consolidation of the states into one vast republic, sure to be aggressive abroad and despotic at home, will be the certain precursor of that ruin which has overwhelmed all those that have preceded it.'

In other words, Lee recognized that centralised power inevitably destroys tradition, liberty, and security. A glance at today's headlines proves Lee was right. And I'd also conclude that recent events, especially the active participation of folks from Dixie, Vermont, and Alaska in the North American Secessionist Convention, prove Alexander Stephens right when he predicted, 'It will not be long, not few years hence, when the cause of the South will be the cause of us all.' Looks like that time has come. Ω

The Quotable Hitler

'The mischief of individual federated states must cease and will some day cease.'
Adolf Hitler

Hitler did to Germany the same as Lincoln did to the United States—reduced the States to mere administrative vassals of the central government. Destruction of State sovereignty, which is the only check against a centralized, all-powerful government, is essential for the establishment of any form of totalitarian government.

As Thomas Jefferson wrote in 1816, 'What has destroyed the liberty and rights of man in every government that has ever existed under the sun? The generalizing and concentrating all . . . powers into one body, no matter whether of the autocrats of Russia and France or of the aristocrats of a Venetian state.'

Hitler quoted from Lincoln's first inaugural address to justify the reduction of the German States. The Soviet Union's Mikhail Gorbachev cited Lincoln as good authority for holding that union together by force. The Chinese premier in 1999, while talking to then-President Clinton, also used Lincoln to justify force to hold China together or to invade Taiwan.

Does it seem a bit puzzling that Americans have been taught to revere the man that the world's most odious dictators use to justify their means of maintaining power?

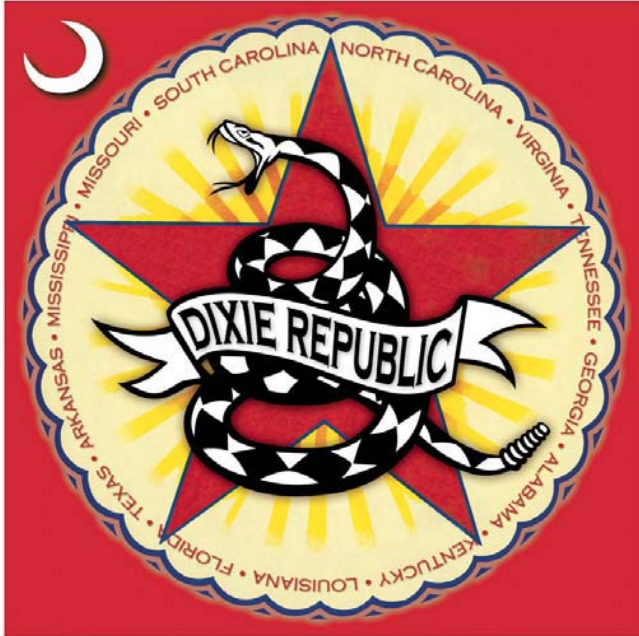
